HOW MANY CLASSES ARE NEEDED FOR MY LAW ENFORCEMENT DEGREE AFTER I COMPLETE THE ACADEMY?

- First of all, Congratulations! You've reached a milestone in your new career! We are here to support and assist you when you are ready for your next steps.
- AAS, Law Enforcement Technology: 8 general education courses
- AAS, Corrections: 14 courses–8 general education/6 restricted elective courses
- AAS, Detention: 15 courses–8 general education/7 restricted elective courses

HOW DO I REQUEST TRANSCRIPTS?

WHAT IF I HAVE CREDITS FROM A PRIOR COLLEGE?

- The credits you earn provide you a certificate of completion, which emphasizes a specific area of study
